

Primary Section



Year 1 classes are following the IPC unit of learning; Sensational! This unit of learning is part of the International Primary Curriculum. In this unit children will recognize the five senses – sight, hearing, taste, smell and touch and these will be explored through a variety of learning activities.

This week the children discovered how sound is made following an experiment using a tuning fork and a bowl of water.

When we hit the tuning fork, it vibrates and then we place it in the water. We can see these vibrations as they spread out across the water, like ripples on a pond. These are known as sound waves.

When we talk or make a sound, the same thing is happening – but the sound waves are invisible because they are moving through the air.

The year 1 children learnt this through discovery!
