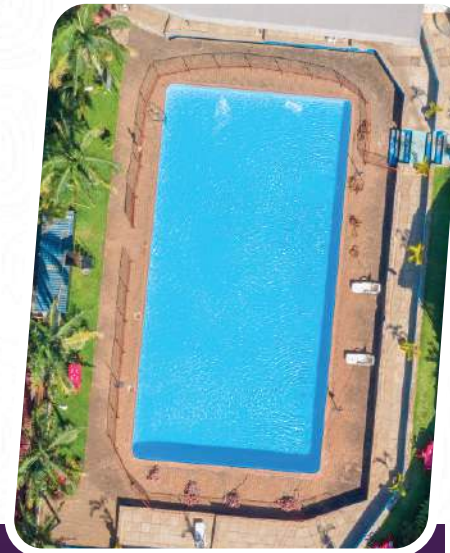

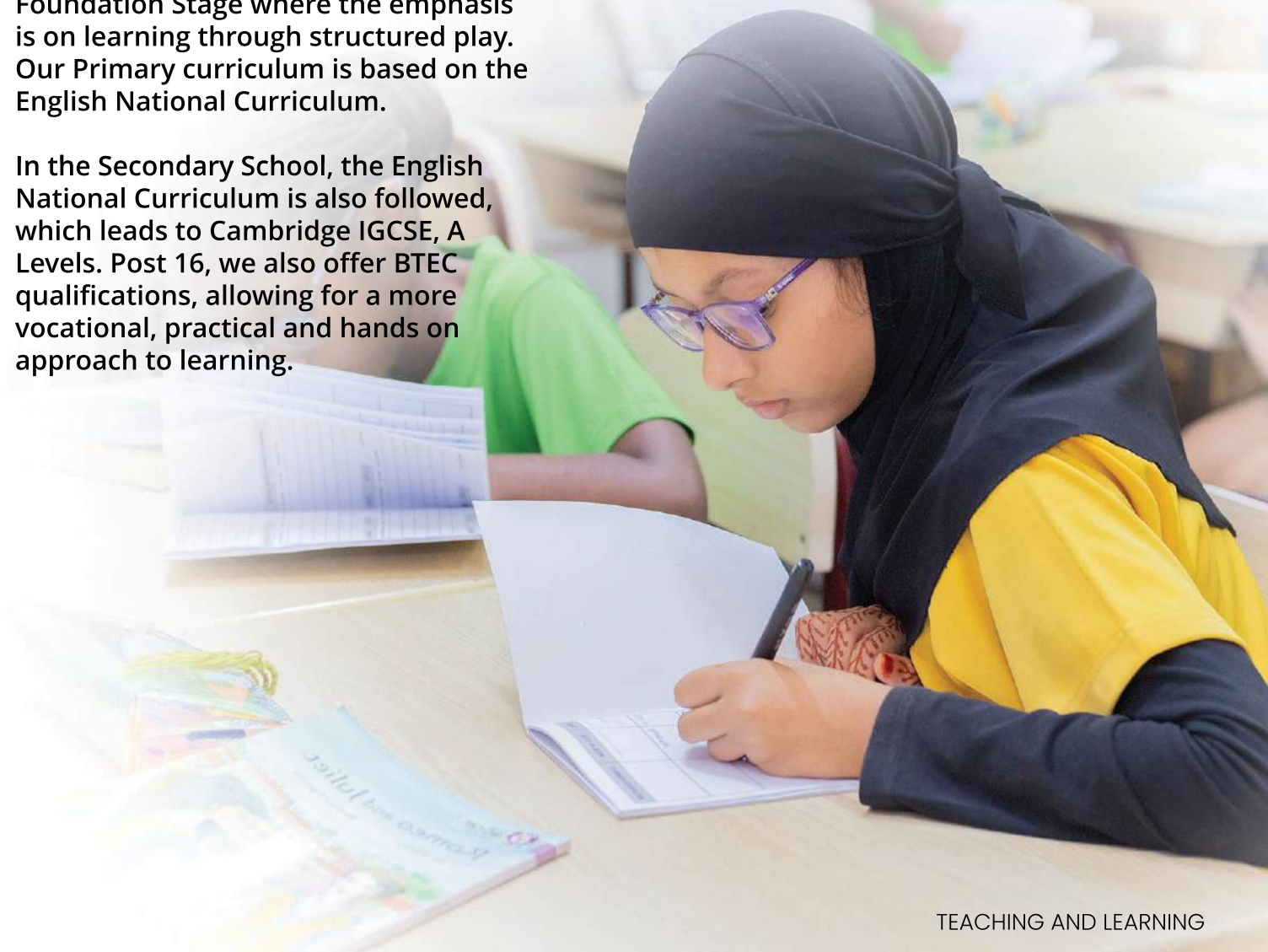
TEACHING AND LEARNING *at Rainbow*



The academic life of Rainbow is guided by two key principles: to offer a balanced and inclusive curriculum that stimulates and challenges every student, and to support our learners in achieving their personal goals.

Our curriculum follows the Early Years Foundation Stage where the emphasis is on learning through structured play. Our Primary curriculum is based on the English National Curriculum.

In the Secondary School, the English National Curriculum is also followed, which leads to Cambridge IGCSE, A Levels. Post 16, we also offer BTEC qualifications, allowing for a more vocational, practical and hands on approach to learning.





EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION

The EYFS curriculum at Rainbow International School is based upon the English National Curriculum's Early Learning Goals and caters for children aged between 2-5 years old. The children are offered a range of experiences and opportunities through active learning. The children learn through structured play and investigation. They are encouraged to talk, observe, plan, question, investigate and explore, through a variety of activities which are continually adapted to suit learning needs and styles.

Learning activities and assessment focus on the 7 different areas of learning and development in EYFS:

The children's personal, social and emotional development is vital as it impacts on all areas of their lives. This provides a sound foundation for success in learning. The nursery and kindergarten class offers a safe, secure, supportive and caring environment, which is vital for children to maximise their all-round development.

In the EYFS classes, there is a high ratio of adults to children and small, secure class sizes and ensures each child has access to support and focused teaching when needed whilst continuously developing the skills and confidence required for independent learning.

PRIMARY



When they leave early years, the children move to primary school - for children from 5 to 11 years old. We cater for the individual, social and academic needs of every child through regular assessment and specific learning programmes, to secure the best outcomes. We implement the English National Curriculum for English and Mathematics, alongside the International Primary Curriculum - a creative and dynamic strategy that supports all learning styles and secures excellent progress. The IPC teaches different subjects through an enquiry led, themed approach, often called a "creative curriculum". Fundamental to children's learning are Personal Learning Goals that help children grow into independent and adaptable learners with a respect and understanding of others. The IPC works within and follows the objectives of the English National Curriculum

Every child has access to specialist teachers in Music, Physical Education, Swimming, Modern Foreign Language and Computing to ensure they benefit from a broad and balanced curriculum.

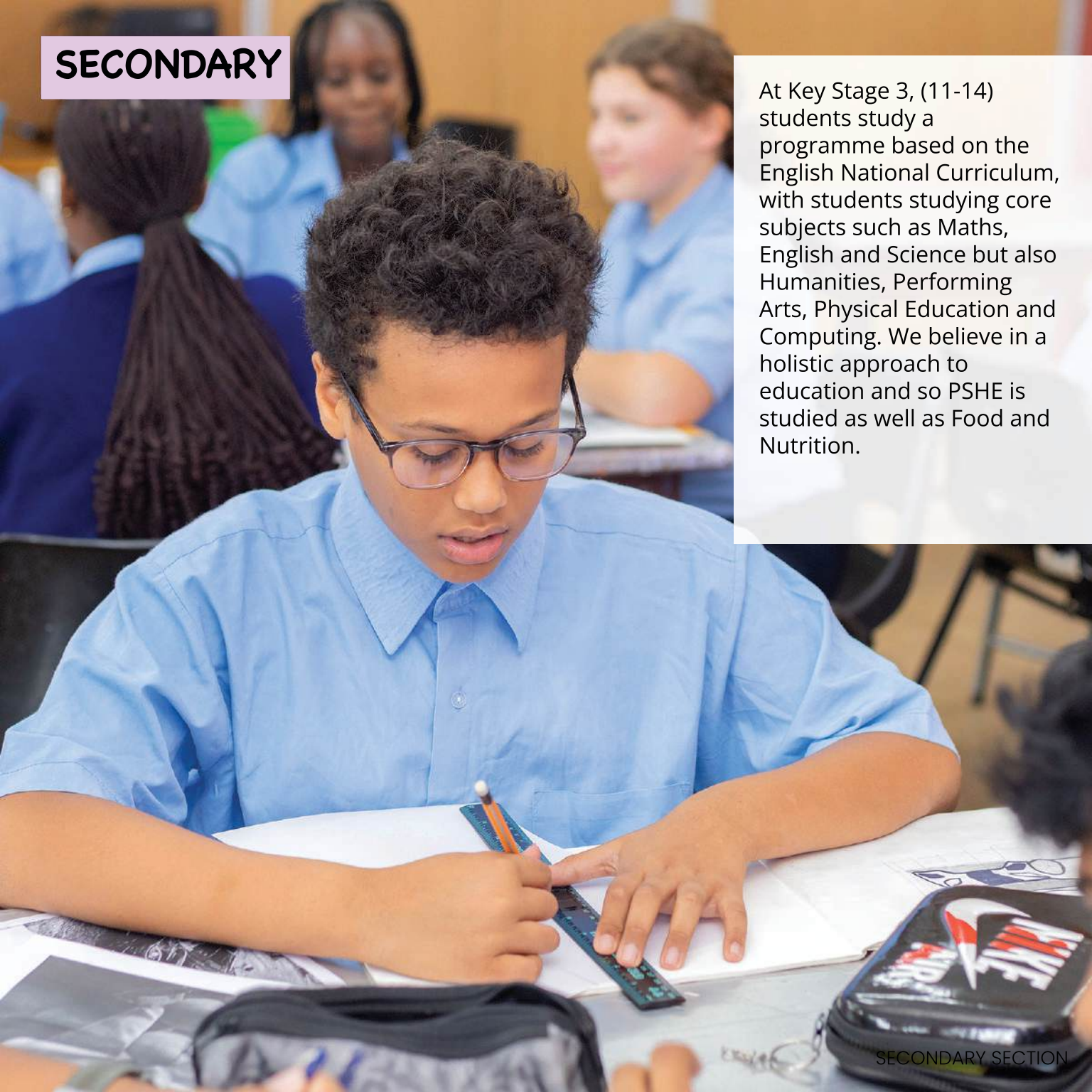
Our aim is for children to leave our care as truly global citizens, highly competent literate and numerate individuals, with a fluency in language and a passion for lifelong learning.



SECONDARY

At Key Stage 3, (11-14) students study a programme based on the English National Curriculum, with students studying core subjects such as Maths, English and Science but also Humanities, Performing Arts, Physical Education and Computing. We believe in a holistic approach to education and so PSHE is studied as well as Food and Nutrition.

At Key Stages 4 and 5 (15-18), we follow Cambridge International Examination syllabuses for IGCSE and A-level respectively, offering a broad choice of subjects. At Key Stage 5, we also offer a BTEC programme which offers a more vocational and practical approach. We offer these in a variety of subjects including Art, Sport, ICT, Hospitality and Business.



ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

Through Assessment for Learning, teachers are able to deepen and further children's learning to support children to become active, lifelong learners.

Assessment throughout the school is of two main types:



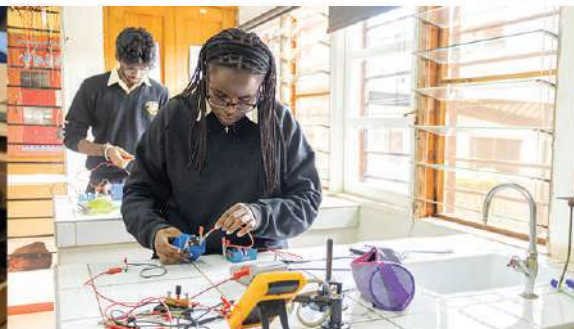
Formative assessment (on-going assessment) which is what practitioners do on a daily basis to make decisions about what the child has learned or can do already, in order to help the child, move on in their learning.

Summative assessment (including Cambridge Checkpoints in year 6) - outcomes of this assessment are recorded and parents and practitioners use the information gained to identify a child's strengths and their learning needs.

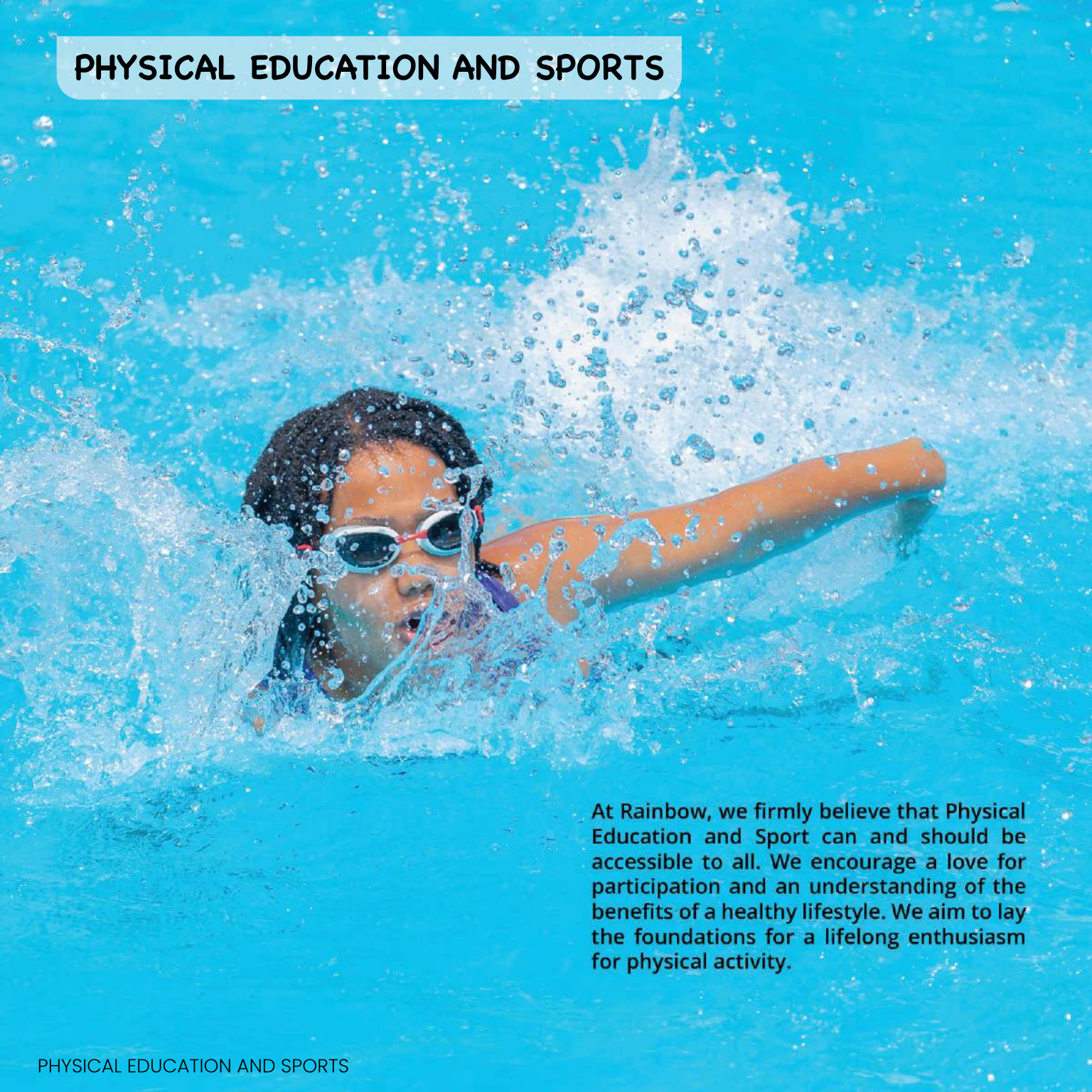


Formative assessment to ensure the student is progressing and understanding their learning in a specific lesson.

Summative assessment - which is recorded every half term, may take the form of a project or a more traditional test. Each half term a student has an attainment grade for homework and class work, as well as formal assessment.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS



At Rainbow, we firmly believe that Physical Education and Sport can and should be accessible to all. We encourage a love for participation and an understanding of the benefits of a healthy lifestyle. We aim to lay the foundations for a lifelong enthusiasm for physical activity.

The PE curriculum offers a broad range of sporting activities, for example football; volleyball; basketball; athletics; swimming among others. There are ample opportunities for our teams and individual students to represent the school, within school as part of inter house tournaments, as well as in local and international sporting events.



CREATIVE AND PERFORMING ARTS



From nursery up to the end of Year 9, students have regular music lessons every week. Skills are developed through learning activities related to IPC and the UK National Curriculum in order to develop musical skills and to experience a range of music from different cultures. They have many opportunities to develop their confidence through performing to their peers and others.

All students are encouraged to learn a musical instrument and the school has a vibrant orchestra and lots of musical enrichment opportunities be it lessons for a specific instrument or implementing technology to create music.



In EYFS and Primary, art is integrated throughout the curriculum and subjects. There's one Art and design lesson every week taught in our dedicated art studio. Art skills are developed alongside the IPC curriculum.

In Secondary, Art is taught as an independent discipline throughout the school and is compulsory at Key Stage 3 but optional at Key Stage 4 and 5. We also have art as an enrichment activity including photography, graphic design or a more traditional artistic focus.

Drama

Drama is an integral part of the English curriculum in EYFS and Primary. Drama and performance skills are used to support the development of literacy and to encourage children to write creatively.

In Secondary, there are opportunities for drama across the curriculum and we regularly run drama as an enrichment activity be it as a small club or a grand school production. All students study Drama up to Year 9 and this incorporates traditional drama such as Greek tragedy and also more modern forms of media such as podcasts and a media studies focus.



Enrichment

Rainbow International School offers a wide variety of enrichment and extra-curricular programmes to all children, ranging from sports to performance and school trips.

There is a broad selection of enrichment activities on offer to students and all children from Year 1 are encouraged to participate. External providers and parents who have a particular expertise or skill occasionally lead after-school clubs too.

We have a broad selection from sports and performing arts to STEM activities, philosophy and chess to international cuisine. We aim to give students exposure to a variety of activities and disciplines so we can discover and nurture

In order to enrich the curriculum, each class has at least one school trip per academic year. These may be day trips (From Year 1) or residential trips (from Year 4). Rainbow has close ties with a number of organisations and centers that are ideal locations to host groups of students. A range of experts and guest speakers are also invited onto our campus to present and lead activities with the students.



ACTION, ADVENTURE AND SERVICE

There is a wide range of activities on offer at Rainbow and students are encouraged to take part in team building and leadership activities which develop understanding of the communities in which students live.

Giving back to the community is a core commitment at RISU. Our student councils (Primary and Secondary) are very active in organising events to fundraise to support local charities which have been chosen by the student body.

Local schools are also supported through regular donations of resources such as books, IT equipment and furniture.

Activities and events are offered which deliver experience of leadership and collaboration, embedding our values of resilience and respect in our students. We participate in the Model United Nations, the East African Model United Nations, COBIS Sporting and Debate events.

Residential trips, both within Uganda and beyond are also offered and students are encouraged to take part as these foster independence, and a greater understanding of different cultures and societies.





BOARDING HOUSE

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Home away from home

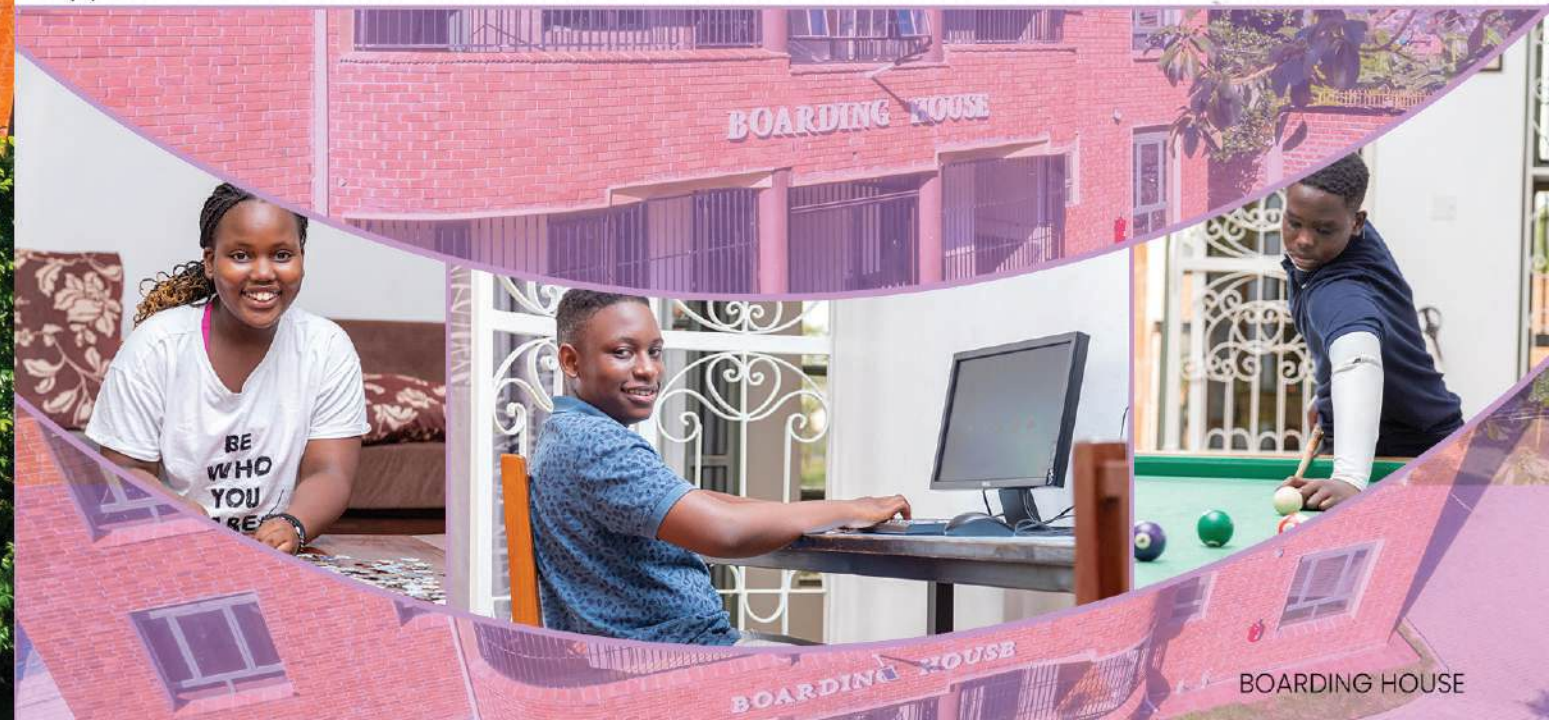
Boarding at Rainbow is a true 'home away from home'. The boarding house is adjacent to the main school campus and is in a modern, quiet and safe environment. There are separate sections for boys and girls. However, boarders come together to share community times, such as meals, prep and leisure.

Every bedroom has ensuite facilities with a maximum of four students sharing a room. There is a fulltime boarding matron and a team of house parents who are dedicated to ensuring the well-being of all the boarders.

All food is prepared by the school's onsite caterers and the menus are agreed upon by the boarders in collaboration with the school's head chef.

Structured activities are organised for the fulltime boarders on a Saturday morning. Also at the weekends, boarders are given the opportunity for supervised leisure activities, such as shopping, going to the cinema or visiting other places of interest.

Boarders are accepted from seven years of age, with full or weekly options available. If you are interested in boarding your child, we actively encourage you to visit our facilities and our boarding team will be very happy to meet with you. Please contact school in order to make an appointment.
